Howard and Marjorie DeNise Fund | 1998 | A trust, created to benefit the surviving spouse, provided that a percentage of the remainder be used to establish this discretionary fund. | \$214,958

Discretionary Grant Endowment Fund | 1977 | A general-purpose fund established by the Community Foundation in its early years. | \$62,331

Ebsary Charitable Fund | 1986 | Transferred from a private foundation established by Frederick G. Ebsary. | \$600,702

Colonel William Hubbel Emerson Memorial Fund | 1977 | For general community needs, with an emphasis on children’s education and welfare. | \$15,346

Matthew and Ruth Fairbank Family Fund | 2006 | An estate gift continues to support the community’s changing needs. | \$186,830

Joan and Harold Feinbloom Supporting Foundation | 1989 | Established as a supporting organization of the Community Foundation after the sale of family-owned Champion Products. | \$4,821,521

Gertrude Ford Fund | 1995 | Dedicated to general community purposes, this fund was made possible by an estate bequest. | \$40,457

Mildred and Walter Fotch Fund | 1986 | Created by an estate bequest. | \$28,363

Founders Fund | 1980 | This fund honors our early Community Foundation supporters. | \$21,550

General Endowment Fund | 1989 | Addresses emerging needs with the help of many donors. | \$2,769,743

Giles Family Fund | 1986 | The donor wanted this fund to support the changing needs of the community after her death. | \$1,019,137

Edwin R. Glossner Fund | 2002 | This fund was created by a bequest to benefit charitable projects in the Rochester area, where this businessman found success. | \$1,605,548

VanBuren and Jane Hansford Fund | 1996 | A permanent endowment remembering a former board member and his wife supports the 21st Century Fund. | \$7,955

Lawrence C. Harris Fund | 1996 | A charitable remainder trust will significantly expand this fund, which supports the Community Foundation's discretionary grantmaking program. | \$122,574

Edna Holland Fund | 1996 | This acorn fund, in memory of the mother of a former Community Foundation board chair, will ultimately provide small grants to assist young people in attaining goals or resolving family problems. | \$7,186

Erma House Fund | 2001 | This general-purpose fund was formed through a revocable trust established by a Rochester resident during her lifetime. | \$425,364

Daniel A. and Mary Louise Jones Fund | 2006 | Created by bequest for the needs of the community, especially those of children. | \$125,272

Warren and Eunice Joslyn Fund | 2001 | A bequest established this discretionary endowment. | \$140,583

Francis H. and Olive C. Kehoe Memorial Fund | 2005 | The widow of a noted art appraiser ensured that their estate would benefit this region forever by creating a discretionary fund. | \$1,458,445

Henry H. Kingston Fund | 1982 | By donating his life insurance policy, this insurance underwriter created a fund to serve charitable needs in greater Rochester. | \$16,461

Laurence J. Kirwan Fund | 2002 | This fund remembers a remarkable civic activist who helped build the Democratic Party in Rochester and New York State. | \$12,528

Kirwan Fund | 2000 | This acorn fund supports the 21st Century Fund while it grows. | \$12,204
