



Henry and Lorraine Brierly met at Plattsburgh University and shared a love of teaching and serving their community. Both taught at Massena Central School District for many years where they created warm, safe, creative and stimulating classrooms for their students.

Henry and Lorraine received their Bachelor's Degrees from SUNY Plattsburgh and completed their Master's Degrees from St Lawrence University.

Henry Brierly was a World War II veteran. He taught in Massena Central School District for 36 years: exemplifying the respect, importance and dedication for the teaching profession he wore a suit and tie daily to work. He wanted the students to know that he felt they were important and worthy of respect.

Lorraine Brierly graduated from Bombay High School and was one of the first women in her town to attend college. Lorraine taught home economics at Massena Central until the birth of her third child. Lorraine continued to teach sewing, cooking and needlework through programs at the Massena Library and St Lawrence Cooperative Extension.

The Henry and Lorraine Brierly Memorial Scholarship recognizes one or more students planning to pursue a degree in education. These students must be patient, generous with their time to help others and committed to the important role that teachers play in the lives of their students.
