They depended on each other to take on family responsibilities and look out for one another. Pat, the only boy and the youngest of five children, had four sisters looking out for him.

Throughout high school at R.L. Thomas, Pat excelled athletically at basketball and football. After graduation he got a "full ride" to Syracuse University where he played football before being drafted into the National Football League by the Denver Broncos and later traded to the New York Jets.

Pat excelled at more than just athletics though. He excelled at caring for others. Pat was always helping others, whether it was as the president of his RLT class, a football player taking time out to give back to the community, a brother and son

helping his family or a friend co-founding a now million-dollar foundation to raise money for a good cause. Pat was a determined person who, once his mind was made up, could do anything he wished. In 2003, he died at the age of 37 from a brain tumor; his wife, son and family remember and honor the man they knew as their brother, son, husband and father. In July of 2007, Patrick J.
