More than 1,000 funds and endowments are administered by the Community Foundation.



Natalie was born on May 18, 1930 in Cleveland, Ohio. She attended Allegheny College, married Malcolm Meyer in 1956, and had two sons: James, born in 1959 and Timothy Charles (T.C.) born in 1960. The family lived in New Jersey and New York City before moving to Pittsford in 1962.

Natalie worked for David Edwards and at Thornell Road School before coming to the attendance office at Mendon High School in the fall of 1977.

After the doctors diagnosed leukemia, she was an example to everyone of an indomitable spirit, never losing her cheerful disposition nor her sense of humor as she convalesced and fought to regain her strength.

Natalie returned to her job in the attendance office in September, 1980 but had to re-enter the hospital, where she succumbed on November 11.

This annual memorial award is presented to a senior boy or girl who exemplifies good citizenship, a sense of responsibility and a caring attitude about others. The student must also be active in school activities and school life – to include sports as either a participant or spectator.
