Arts Action Area

Recommendations are supported by:

- Community Impact Fund: Unrestricted fund for general charitable and educational purposes.
- Jazz Street Fund: This fund was created by a challenge grant from a community philanthropist to support free public jazz performances during the Rochester International Jazz Festival.
- Rodney Hatch Family Fund: A charitable remainder trust established this fund to support the arts. To distribute \$10,000 to Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra for its Sustainability Initiative

City of Rochester: \$20,000

The Arts and Culture Plan will be a user-friendly and implementation-oriented document that will include an arts and culture inventory, a public arts master plan, and a strategic framework with a set of goals and actions that will guide decision making.

Rochester International Jazz Festival, LLC: \$40,000

The Rochester International Jazz Festival will provide free performances for additional artists/musical groups programmed at the outdoor stage on Gibbs/Jazz Street in June 2023.

GOAL: STRENGTHEN REGIONAL VITALITY Environmental Justice & Sustainability Action Area

Recommendations are supported by:

- Gonsenhauser Family Fund: Created in memory of a Brighton dairy farmer to support farm animal welfare and agricultural education, particularly about dairy, urban and/or sustainable farming.
- *H Fund:* A bequest created this fund to support environmental programs and organizations that assist abused and homeless women.

Orleans County Cornell Cooperative Extension: \$10,000

Orleans County Cornell Cooperative Extension has partnered with Everybody Solar to make a transition to renewable energy and bring a 24.65 kW solar array to their grounds.
