#### New York State Council on the Arts Regranting: \$296,150

In Spring 2022, New York State Council on the Arts awarded a grant to Rochester Area Community Foundation Initiatives to distribute one-time grants for arts projects by nonprofit and public organizations in the Foundation's eight-county region. #### FUNDS THAT SUPPORT Changing Needs

#### **Forever Funds**

These funds support the community and the Community Foundation's role as a catalyst for positive, enduring change. The flexibility of Forever Funds provides an effective means to match donor generosity with the dynamic nature of our region's ever-changing needs.

Shirley A. King Pay It Forward Fund, 2022: A single mom, who relocated to Rochester because of its livability, created this fund to give back to the community that has given so much to her.

Ann M. Mayer Fund, 2022: A bequest from a retired Churchville-Chili Central School District elementary school teacher and librarian and co-author of nonfiction children's books, established this fund to support the community. \$67,403

**Nathan Robfogel Discretionary Fund,** 2022: A Community Foundation founding board member used proceeds from an insurance policy to create this fund to support the changing needs of the community. \$55,169

John B. Rumsey, 2023: A longtime journalist for Rochester's former *Times-Union* requested that this advised fund convert to one that will support the everchanging needs of our community forever. \$88,591

#### FUNDS THAT SUPPORT Broad Causes

**Clairebear Fund,** 2022: An Ontario County family established this fund in memory of their four-year-old daughter to help parents with sick children who are far from home.
