LGBT+ Philanthropists Raise \$45,000, Founding Member Doubles Annual Gift

"With support from the Giving Circle, we are able to produce events like our 2025 film festival, which brings LGBTQ+ films, artwork, music, and culture to Rochester to showcase individual stories, celebrate authentically and build community."

Other of the Circle's grantees provide critical support for LGBTQ+ community members at no cost, like free mental health counseling for veterans and survivors of domestic violence.

The Giving Circle's goal is to pool resources to build safer, more affirming communities where all can thrive. The nonprofits receiving grants serve the community through advocacy and programs focused on the arts, youth leadership, healthcare, and community safety.
